

## Do you know about Friends Quick Picks?

A new offering is now available at the Blackstone Library to give you the benefit of getting a new book quicker. At its annual meeting in June 2022, the Friends donated \$5,000 to the library to fund a collection of best-selling books. These books are reserved for in person checkout only.

Fifty-five best sellers have been ordered to date, and the purchase of additional books will continue.
Friends Quick Picks have a 2-week loan period; cannot be placed on hold; and cannot be renewed. They are available in a special area at the library located



near the New Fiction. In browsing the catalog, you will find these books listed as "Branford/Blackstone Friends Quick Picks."

#### Friends—Volunteer Spotlight

Each issue one special volunteer will be recognized for their contribution to Friends.

#### **Andrea Schieckel**

This month we are delighted to honor Andrea Schieckel! For over a decade Andrea has been a strong presence overseeing the children's book area of the Friends. Like many of our volunteers, Andrea's love of books and reading led her to the library following retirement. She taught English at Walsh Intermediate School for many years. So, it seemed the right decision to accept the Friend's request to take on the responsibility of coordinating the children's section of the annual Friends Book Sale in 2007. She and Anne Tartaglione reorganized the intake of books, established new categories and streamlined the pricing methods. They recruited a group of volunteers to join them sorting and pricing donated books for the sale each year. The result of their work was a

separate area under the tent exclusively for children and teens that delighted customers and increased revenue for the library. In 2011 Andrea and Anne received an award from the



Friends of Connecticut Libraries for their accomplishments – the Focused Project Award for that year.

The children's book area continues to be a favorite spot under the tent for people of all ages. Andrea and the team have continued to expand services separating over 60 favorite series for easy selection during sales, providing local day care centers with books for their students, as well as

donating books to the halfway houses in CT.

Another important interest for Andrea was volunteering for IRIS, the immigrant refugee service in New Haven. There, she taught English to new immigrants and assisted with their resettlement. She is married to Jon Clark, who was honored this year as a Friends board member and was coordinator of the adult section for many years. Andrea and Jon have three children and three grandchildren.

We are grateful for the time and effort Andrea has given to the Friends. Her preparations for the book sales – establishing the map for categories, signage, special displays and more resulted each year in a wonderful Children's Book Shop under the tent! She has been a most valued member of the Friends and a good friend to the many volunteers who have worked with her over the years.
