### Meet the 2023 Friends Scholarship Recipient, Alondra Lopez

Alondra Lopez was born in California, raised in Arizona, received her undergraduate degree from Pennsylvania and her master's in teaching in New York. In 2020 Lopez moved to Connecticut and said there was always a constant in her life wherever she lived. "In each state one thing has remained the same; I've had a library card and have found comfort and consistency in public libraries. My parents fostered a love of reading and taught my sisters and I that literacy is opportunity, and this is something I have taken to heart.", shared Lopez.

Lopez was selected to receive the Friends scholarship because of her dedication to continue her studies and get a master's in library and information Science (MLIS) along with her past work as a teacher and her current part-time work at the James Blackstone Memorial Library. This scholarship from the Friends will help to allow her to complete her studies and graduate in December of 2023.



Lopez discussed what this scholarship means to her. "For me, it's the acknowledgement and the contribution of 'we want more library professionals.' I received a great undergrad scholarship because I came from a low-income background and it also helps that my family was born in Mexico and I am a woman of color so knowing that my workplace was willing to support me when I hadn't been here for that long, it's the inclusivity. Even if the Friends had decided to give me five dollars, even that recognition, that acknowledgement that 'you are a part of the community, we see you, we know what you are doing."

### **Jane Bouley**

This month we are celebrating Jane Bouley, our History, Art, Vintage and all round go-to Friends' volunteer.

Jane moved to Branford when she was eight years' old and has fond memories of being taken to visit all the historical places by her grandmother who wanted

to pass on her own love of history.

Fast forward to the present where Jane is the Branford Town Historian and regularly asked to give talks and presentations on local history. She has also written several books on the subject including "The Civil War Soldiers of Branford, Connecticut" and "The Origin and Naming of Branford's Streets". It's no surprise therefore that she was asked to sort the History section as a volunteer for the Friends at their book warehouse as well as helping to corral all the Vintage books ready for review. During a review of subject sorters last year, however, we discovered that Jane is also very passionate about art. When she retired, she had finally had the time to indulge her interest in art

and by visiting galleries and special exhibitions, she built up a wealth of knowledge that she now applies to the sorting of the Art section. Did we also say she sorts the Coffee Table books and in her spare time is working on the manuscript of a new book?

Jane has been associated with the Friends for many years. She was one of the earliest members and spent several years serving on the Board. She started volunteering in the early days of the Fall Book Sale when asked for help by a friend and has not stopped helping ever since. We are so thankful for her knowledge and experience, and her willingness to share them with us all.
