Due to rising prices to host this event, Friends have been hard at work to find alternate ways to raise funds to offset these costs through our "Raise the Tent' campaign. Sponsors both business and individuals have responded and are generously supporting our event. Our goal is to keep the book

sale prices unchanged. We are passionate about literacy and books and want to make this a fun experience of exploring and finding interesting and exciting books available to everyone.



Friends have put in extra work to improve the organization of the different categories of books at the book sale, so that shoppers can easily find what they are looking for by only having to look in one place to find that special title. We have also added new categories such as Pop Culture and all fiction/mysteries hard-cover and softcover are now integrated and alphabetized by the last name of the author. Biographies and mass market

paperback have also been reorganized for ease of finding.

Our Friends volunteers work all year long to prepare for the book sale and to make it better than the year before. All monies raised from our book sales after expenses are given to the Blackstone Library. In the recently completed fiscal year, Friends gave \$70,000 to Blackstone library.

In the auditorium of the Blackstone Library on June 20th, the Friends Board and Friends members gathered to celebrate the conclusion of another very successful year of raising funds for the Blackstone Library. Following a short business meeting, a very interesting and informative presentation on the history of James and Timothy Blackstone was presented by Jane Bouley, Town Historian. The highlight of the gathering was the presentation of a \$70,000 check to the Blackstone Library, representing the total amount of money gifted to the Library from July 2022 thru June 2023. The money is used for enrichment programs, events, and materials for the library.

When talking with Friends volunteer Susan Rowan it quickly becomes apparent that she is passionate about children learning to read and enjoying books. This should come as no surprise after having spent 40 years as a 2nd grade teacher at Brushy Plains School (now known as Murphy.)

As a teacher, Susan became well acquainted with children's literature, a skill she now puts to very good use as a member of the Children's Book Sorting Team. Soon after she retired in 2007, she was approached by a friend to become involved in sorting books with the Friends. Seeing this as a good way to give back to the community, she agreed, and 16 years later she is still sorting.

The sorting of the children's books is very much a team effort. On Tuesdays and Thursday afternoons the team – Susan, Theresa Hofmeister, Barbara Johnson, Donna



Mazzoca, Pat Mooney, and Evy Moulton – gather at the Volunteer Center to sort their way through the many hundreds of books that are donated weekly. After eliminating those in poor condition, they clean, price, and pack the books ready to be stored for the Fall Sale. Good duplicates do not go to waste as they are passed on to local daycare centers and used as giveaways at the Branford

Festival and the Scare-crow Festival.

Susan's other passion is travel and with her husband, Paul, she has travelled extensively both within the US and abroad. Among her favorite places to visit are the Scandinavian countries and Tunisia, but her dedication to sorting children's books for the Friends is a priority that always comes first.

In her own words - "the greatest gift we can give our children is the ability to be a fluent reader"

Friends Spring Sale

This past May – just before Mother's Day – the Friends held a Spring Sale at our warehouse on School Ground Road. It was another opportunity for the Friends to offer summer reading material, showcase our volunteer workspace, as well as to raise funds to support enrichment programs for the Blackstone Library. Our volunteers met over 300 patrons who visited us at our warehouse featuring adult fiction and childrens books at our bargain prices of \$3 and under. We raised over \$3,700 during our 12hour sale that weekend!
