In the 12 years that I have worked at the Blackstone Library, I have seen firsthand the impact the Friends make. When 3D printers were becoming widespread, the Friends were there, giving a gift enabling the library to purbut sewing machines, circuitry kits and more, supporting countless hours of educational Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) programming and hands-on experiences for our comue to help expand our Li-

brary of Things, offering even more varied hands-on experiences for people at home and in the library.

Special purchases like the 3D printers and the library's new fish tank (which delight parents and children alike each time they visit Youth Services), give our community new opportunities to expand their horizons and ignite their imaginations. That is the true gift the Friends give to Branford.

In addition to special purchases, the Friends help supchase not only a 3D printer, port other expenditures the library makes, things that are not part of our operating budget but that we rely on, year after year, to make our collection and staff as dynamic and responsive to the community's needs as possible. The Friends help the Blackmunity. The Friends contin- stone pay for streaming services including Kanopy, Pronunciator and Hoopla; museum discount passes; children's, teen and adult programs; books for the Bestseller book club and Friends Quick Picks; continuing education opportunities for staff; furniture; software to support the museum pass program and event registrations; and more.

The Friends of the Blackstone work extremely hard yearround to raise funds that support so many in the community. Your efforts help contribute tens of thousands of dollars to the library each year, but the impact the Friends have on what the library can offer, year after year, is immeasurable. 
A man of many talents, Neil was a member of the New Haven Chorale for 5 years and now sings Bass with the First Congregational Church choir in Branford.
