bunch of books from my romance reading list". Books offered for sale were fiction, literature, and children's books along with DVDs and audio books, puzzles and a special collection of boating books. Readers of all ages came with lists of their favorite authors and genres, many left with not only what they wanted but with books by authors they haven't read. A happy customer said, " why not, it's only \$3." As volunteers who love what we do, it was heartwarming to see children picking out books and even sitting on the floor reading their new purchases. Our readers delighted in their choices and prices and how they will have happy times over the summer working through their books. Friends—Volunteer Spotlight

When passing by the Friends of JBML, if you see a shiny new red SUV parked on Thompson Road, it means that Ann Davis is in our warehouse scanning books. A volunteer for five years, she started with picking up book donations, then curated literature and she co-chaired the Fall Book Sale of 2023.

Born in the UK, Ann's family moved to Ontario, Canada – where she lived from the age of two through veterinary school. She moved back to England to work as a vet at a small animal clinic, and then returned to Canada to earn a PHD in Immunology in Toronto. She then spent six years doing post-doctorate studies in Houston, Texas learning to make "designer" mice. The 90's brought Ann to Connecticut to work at Bayer Pharmaceuticals in West Haven looking for new drug targets for diabetes. Post Bayer, she worked at the Central Veterinary Hospital Emergency Clinic on State St. and at the Veterinary Associates of Westville. She re-



turned to Canada for seven years to take care of elderly parents and, while there, she found personal satisfaction in volunteering at "St. John's Kitchen" – a soup kitchen where both the clients and volunteers pitched in to do the work. Ann found that she liked to "feed people –both physically and mentally", which led to her volunteering at The Sunrise Café (<u>sunrisecafenewhaven.org</u>). The Sunrise Cafe serves free breakfast to a hungry crowd from a menu of choices five days a week at 57 Olive St. in New Haven.

Interested in combining two of her volunteer activities, Ann sorts through the discarded books of Friends (duplicates or books in poor condition) each week and takes them to a mobile library cart at Sunrise Café. She then talks to the guests and listens to suggestions for what they would like to read and recommends some of her favorite books. The most popular requests are Fiction, Biography, Self-help, Bibles, Science Fiction, Sports as well as Black History.

When not involved in good works projects, Ann enjoys her 110 lb. Lab "Otis", gardening, reading, swimming and sailing in LI Sound. When asked what she admired most about Friends, her response was "the flexibility in the activities and scheduling and the energy levels of both Barbara and Joe!"

Friends of JBML Expands Their Reach to Kenya

Friends has recently begun to support American Friends of Kenya (AFK) - located in Wethersfield, CT by providing donated books that cannot be used in our sales or are left over from our sales. Two Friends' Volunteers, Louisa Coraluzzi, and Penny Peterson, coordinate with AFK volunteers to set aside the types of books wanted. When AFK has collected enough books to fill a tractor trailer (which is approximately once a year), the books are shipped by AFK to leaders to some of the poorest regions of Kenya, providing them with resources and training materials. Every leader is responsible for creating or expanding community and school libraries and spreading a love of reading throughout their communities. Since 2004, AFK has shipped over 500,000 books to Kenya, with most coming from communities and school libraries in CT, Friends' book sales, and special book drives. AFK also collects other donated materials like shelving, furniture, and other library materials.

A primary focus of the community and school libraries is fostering book clubs. AFK sends "book club kits" with at least 10 copies per title and information on how to organize and facilitate book club discussions for various age groups. This is a milestone for Kenya. Book clubs were virtually unheard of before the formation of AFK. AFK has been a major force in library development in Kenya, and CT libraries and librarians have been at the forefront. At Friends we are happy to support AFK and grateful to Louisa and Penny for their leadership in coordinating our support. AFK allows the Friends of JBML to be true to our mission of providing affordable books to all our communities here and abroad.
